01 - OVERVIEW OF THE BIBLE

I.- GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE BIBLE: The Bible contains 66 books: 39 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament.

The Old Testament was mostly written in the Hebrew language. Some portions were written in Aramaic.

- 268 Verses of Old Testament were written in Aramaic – portions of Daniel, Ezra, Jeremiah.

The New Testament was written in the Greek language (Koine) with some Aramaic words.

II.- BASIC DIVISIONS OF SCRIPTURE:

A.- OLD TESTAMENT OVERVIEW: The Old Testament explains our origins (Creation of the universe, and Earth). It explains Creation of Man, his authority over creation, his sin of disobedience; the subsequent curse of sin over mankind as well as creation. The Old Testament also explains God's plan for redemption of mankind and His covenant with Israel.

It also provides an Eschatological (end times) explanation for mankind and creation; also foretelling of past, current and forthcoming world powers and their role in the last days.
